regarding the Air Conditioning in the Church and how loud it is and how insufficient the units are working. I had two estimates prepared: one for central air, which consists of (4) units that are (15 seer); the estimate is \$22,800. The Central Air units would also provide us with warmth in Sept, Oct, Nov, Mar, Apr when we just need to remove the chill and not have the boiler running at full capacity. The second estimate that I received was for (4) units that are (8.5 seer) which are less efficient and loud, the estimate is \$14,210. We have been offered monies toward the above expense but unfortunately the estimates are higher than anticipated and not in our current budget. I would appreciate any financial input or information that you may have in this regard.

On August 28, 2011, Hurricane Irene left a path of flooding and devastation throughout the Diocese of Albany. Four days later Tropical Storm Lee arrived and furthered the damage. 11 counties of the Albany Diocese were declared Federal Disaster Areas. The Response

From the last days of August until now, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany staff and volunteers alongside Parish volunteers have mobilized to assist their neighbors who lost so much.
