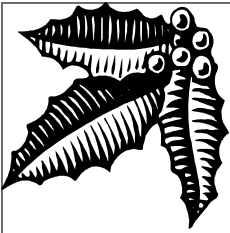

On November 3rd our students will be receiving the mandatory diocesan safe environment training.
