My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Have you ever wondered how it is, that God works in our lives in mysterious ways? Truly, the Easter mysteries remind us of this over and over, as we see the Holy Spirit among us moving quietly and gently. This weekend, is the last class of the year for our Faith Formation Program. Registration for next year is being held this weekend. We have been gifted in so many ways during the catechetical year. This year we started the implementation of a text program: created a handbook:: organized a Confirmation team; ran wonderful retreats for our Confirmandi and First communicants; designed and implemented a syllabus for each grade level; increased parental participation; continued with the Children's liturgy; increased the use of technology for some of our classroom instruction; taught our kids how to pray and worship: designed binders for each of the retreats with materials for parents and students to use at home; parents attended meetings themselves to improve their knowledge and understanding of the sacraments of Reconciliation. However, had I not come here, I never would have met such a wonderful and giving group of people. Some have asked me if I will be returning and I have learned to leave that up to God!



On Thursdays during the month of May, Deacon Jim will present the first five episodes of Fr. Robert Barron's Catholicism project. We will meet at 7:00 P.M. in Room 5 to view the video, reflect and discuss. The first episode is entitled Amazed and Afraid - The Revelation of God Become Man. Future episodes will discuss the teachings of Jesus, the mystery of God, Mary the Mother of God and the missionary adventure of Peter and Paul.

Fr. Robert Barron of Word on Fire Ministries has produced a 10 episode education program on the wonders of our Catholic Faith. This vision seeks to explore, through a global journey, the living culture of the Catholic Church. From the lands of the Bible, to the great shrines of Europe, to the shores and heartland of America, to the mysteries of Asia, to the rich landscapes of Latin America, to the beating heart of Africa-- and beyond, witness the passion and glory of the faith that claims over a billion of the earth's people as its own.

Father Robert Barron illuminates and explains the conviction of the Catholic Faith that Jesus of Nazareth is the promised Messiah, and the revelation of God become man. He shows how Jesus fulfills the four talks of the Messiah, according to the Old and New Testaments, and how the living legacy of Christ, God and Messiah, is proclaimed by the Church. Join Father Barron as he addresses some of the most controversial questions about the life and identity of Jesus Christ and travels through the mysterious and sacred places of the Holy Land of Israel and the eternal city of Rome.
