The Taize Community is an ecumenical monastic order in Taize, Saone-et-Lorie, Burgundy, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Protestant and Catholic traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schultz, a Protestant. Through repetitive and simplistic musical lines, silence, and through the use of candles, incense, and soft lighting, Taize services are very reverent, peaceful, and calming. Please take one hour, in the midst of the Holiday Season, to come and enjoy an experience that will remain with you during the new year. If you have never experienced a Taize service.
