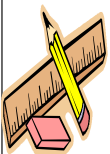

My Dear Parishioners:

All Aboard! It will not be long before the season of giving is upon us. It was decided by the catechists that this year we would like to have faith formation focus on projects around the parish. It has been agreed upon to construct a train that represents various ways of giving to the parish community. We are asking for the full support of our parish in this great adventure. By supporting us we are asking that you join us. The various cars of the train include box car, cattle car, gondola, coal hopper, flat car, passenger car, caboose and last but not least the engine. Father Jim Kane, of course, will be our honorary conductor (hat and all) and each grade will be responsible for a car on the train and a specific project. One of the challenges for the students will be to bring their parents to Mass and fill the car. The grade that brings the highest number of parents will be given a pizza party. This will be fun and parents get ready!

Once a month we will also begin having faith formation students responsible for serving in the various ministries during Mass. On Nov. 24th expect to see our confirmation candidates serving as ministers at the 10am Liturgy. 9th grade will be in December along with a bake sale to continue the tradition of giving bibles to the confirmation students. Grade 7/8 will serve in January, Grades 5/6 in February, Grades 3/4 in March, K/1 in April and Grade 2 in May, of course will coincide with our May crowning. 2nd grade parents are reminded of the meeting concerning First Penance and Reconciliation on Nov.3rd after the 10am Liturgy. 2nd graders will attend class that day. This is also the day that the safe environment training will take place for all students. If you recall, the letter that was recently sent, you only need to send it back if your child is not attending the presentation.

We are looking for donations for our program. We are in need of construction paper, particularly green and red, also, glue, scissors, crayons, pencils, markers, white paper lined and unlined, glitter, tape, hand sanitizer and Kleenex. There will be a box in the back of the church, for your donations.

As always we are in need of teacher assistants. This is a wonderful ministry, that is very rewarding to all. Before you know it the colder weather will sneak upon us and the hectic season and time for giving to the less fortunate will arrive
