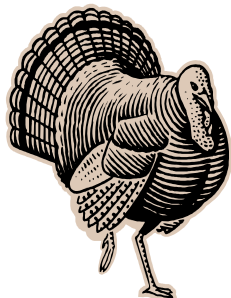

Last Sunday we listened to our Deacon Steve Young preach about Zacchaeus and having to climb a tree to see Jesus as he came to Jericho. The most unsuspected things happened and Zacchaeus ended up having the Lord stay with him, even though tax collectors were not the usual company of the Jewish people. In spite of all of this, Zacchaeus was given an opportunity for the conversion of heart and he quickly said to the Lord, “Behold half of my possessions I shall give to the poor and if I have extorted anyone, I shall repay them four times over.” The Lord replied that “Today salvation had come to this house.” One of the points to also remember here is that not only did Zacchaeus have to climb the tree to see the Lord but had to go out on a limb for this to be accomplished.
