I can't believe that blessed person is *me*... and I will forever be grateful to him (and his wife Maureen whose love and support makes his ministry possible) for his love and his incredible work on our behalf.

I feel so **joyful** that God has brought us all together at this time and has given us the opportunity to begin a new adventure in faith.
